Dear prospective member:

Ten years ago, our financial markets collapsed on a scale that has not been known before, viscerally making us aware of our interdependencies, the unpredictable nature of human behavior, and the painful breakdown of trust in our leadership.

Ten years later, society is still struggling with the impact of technology on the self and its sense of security and identity. We are torn between despising our political leaders who tweet and behave like Hollywood celebrities, and being fascinated and admiring their ability of showing up as "one of us" or "one of the people".

Ten years on, we struggle no less with the tension between trust in that which is shown to us and that which is unknown to us: be it through personal information stolen through the internet, or social injustice exposed through the #MeToo movement. We are torn between the promise of the global, technological world in protecting our economic growth and our environment and the lived-experience of the technological world being potentially destructive to our ecology.

Questions of identity, nationality, belonging and personal value stand in tension to the process of a globalised economy and multinational enterprises. What is the nature of one's own accountability? If you struggle with these questions too, this conference is the place for you. You will have opportunities to learn about the place of feelings, impressions, expectations, thoughts, fantasies, fears, likes, and dislikes as they reverberate in the conference. This conference weaves a fabric that makes up the understanding, the relationships, and the relatedness among individuals, groups, organisations, and systems.

You are invited to take up the challenge of learning both about what is known, but more so about what is not yet known in organisational life, and explore the relationships between the organisation we are creating together in the conference and its social, political and economic environments.

Primary Task

The primary task is to study the intra- and inter-personal, inter-group, and organizational behavior and dynamics as they unfold in the here-and-now of the conference as a temporary organization within its context.
