## **Dear prospective member:**

The past two and a half years have been marked by considerable change and confusion. From the COVID19 pandemic to social upheaval within the United States and around the world, our sense of normalcy and security has been upended. We've experienced loss, isolation, fear, and uncertainty. And yet, through technology, adaptation, resourcefulness, and resilience, we have also found new, utilitarian, and often meaningful and significant ways to connect and transform.

During this time, we've experienced false starts at returning to interpersonal and societal "normalcy." Yet we remain in a transitional space awaiting whatever the new normal may be.

How do we work with energy and integrity on behalf of the myriad groups and organizations to which we belong?

This group relations conference (GRC) will offer conference participants many opportunities to examine these questions and more that emerge from the conference theme and from our collective work. Conference staff and members will engage in the shared work of exploring our ubiquitous unconscious group processes and dynamics as they evolve in the here-and-now of the weekend.



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#### Please note:

The GRC is an experiential learning conference and it is designed for members to learn about group and organizational processes. ## You will have an opportunity to learn:


- Conscious and unconscious factors that shape participation in groups
